# Why Respect?

- It underpins everything at Steeple Claydon
- We want every child to have the opportunity to shine - can only happen when children feel valued, safe and supported by those around them.
- Understand that their actions, words and attitudes have an impact on others
- Respect enables them to build strong relationships, resolve disagreements positively and develop a genuine sense of belonging.

# Why Curiosity?



- It is at the heart of learning
- Oracy – ask questions, explore new ideas, challenge others
- It comes natural to the children – we want to develop that lifelong love of learning
- Embrace opportunities and challenge



# How can MAGEE help at home?



## Respect

- Children learn respect primarily through the examples they see around them. Model positive relationships and encourage children to consider the feelings and perspectives of others.
- Encouraging children to take responsibility for their actions and make amends when mistakes are made.



# How can MAGEE help at home?



## Resilience

- Support your children to face challenges rather than protect from every difficulty.
- Praising effort, perseverance and determination rather than focusing solely on outcomes.
- Encouraging children to try new things and step outside their comfort zone.
- Helping children view mistakes as opportunities to learn and improve.
- Sharing stories of times when you faced challenges and how you overcame them.
- Teaching children strategies for managing disappointment and frustration.
- Celebrating progress and personal growth, however small.



# How can MAGEE help at home?



## Curiosity

- Opportunities to explore, question and discover.
- Welcoming and encouraging questions, even when you do not know the answer.
- Reading together regularly and discussing what you have read.
- Exploring the local community, nature and new experiences together.
- Encouraging children to pursue their interests and hobbies.
- Asking open-ended questions such as, "What do you think?" or "Why do you think that happened?"
- Showing enthusiasm for learning new things yourself.
