Code of Conduct

Code of Conduct

- Always remember you are a role model to the pupils/players.
- Try to demonstrate positive body language and attitude at all times.
- Use the correct and appropriate language.
- Ensure that your pupils/team are playing by the rules set out.
- Ensure that the safety of your pupils/team is a priority.
- Accept mistakes as an important part of learning.
- Assess your own performance as well as your pupils/teams.
- Encourage all players to improve, regardless of their ability.
- Publicly accept all official judgements.
- Strive to make all pupils/team members feel valued.
- Remember you are there for the pupils/team, not for you.
- Show appreciation of all opponents in a positive way when results are given out.

Code of Conduct

- Remember that striving to win is more important than winning itself.
- Help your child to recognise good performance, not just results.
- Always try and be positive. If criticism is needed, then be constructive.
- Respect teachers/coaches decisions.
- Encourage your child to learn the rules and play within them.
- Aim to be a good role model for your child.
- Use correct and proper language at all times.
- Support your child's involvement and help them to enjoy sport.
- Applaud good play from both sides.
- Encourage your team and its players only, let the teacher/coach run the team.
- Publicly accept officials judgements.
- Enjoy the game.
